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**Proposal:** Eco-design as a common ground for meeting needs in accommodation, food supply and apparel while living in a disturbed environment.

**Question:** How to tackle environmental crisis by changing fundamentals of our paradigm?

**Thema:** Transportation, agriculture, finance and education were built on colonial foundations.

Humankind is not a destined form of being or tip of the hierarchy but merely one among other life forms. Suggesting a design that meets ecological welfare.
